## Bible Study on Matthew 11:28

- 2. How is the rest Jesus offers different from the world's idea of rest?
- 3. What does it mean to truly "come to Jesus" for rest?
- 4. Can you think of a time when you personally experienced the rest Jesus offers?
- 5. How do other scriptures, such as Philippians 4:6-7 and John 14:27, reinforce the idea of finding peace in Christ?

## Section 3: Applying Matthew 11:28 to Our Lives

- 1. What are some practical ways we can respond to Jesus' invitation to "come" to Him?
- 2. What personal burdens are you carrying that you need to surrender to Jesus?
- 3. How does trusting in Jesus change the way we handle stress and anxiety?
- 4. What role does prayer and scripture meditation play in receiving God's rest?
- 5. How can you encourage others who are weary and burdened to find rest in Jesus?
