Verse Focus: Isaiah 41:10

"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, fo<mark>r l</mark> am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Section 1: Understanding God's Presence ("I am with you")
